RECYCLING DIRECTIONS

Empty liquid and food contents, do not crush.
Place lid back on if empty. Number 1, 2, & 5

- Plastic Swimming Pools

PAPER

RECYCLING DIRECTIONS

Remove any non-paper materials (metal clips, plastic bindings, metal spirals, plastic newspaper sleeves, etc.). Small staples and paper clips are OKAY. Plastic windows in envelopes are OKAY.

YES - RECYCLING BIN

- Office Paper (*Paperclips & staples are OK*)
- Computer Paper
- Scratch Paper
- Notebook Paper (*Remove spiral, metal or plastic bindings*)
- Newspaper (*Remove plastic banding, rubber bands or plastic sleeves*)
- Brown Paper Bags (*Twine handles OK*)
- Brown Packing Paper
- Colored Paper (*All different colors*)

PAPER CONTINUED

- Paper Envelopes (*Stamps and plastic windows are OK*)
- Magazines (*Remove plastic wrap*)
- Magazine Inserts
- Brochures (*All types*)
- Flyers
- Junk Mail (*Staples okay*)
- Catalogs (*Remove metal or plastic binding*)
- Paper Cups (*No Styrofoam*)
- Paperback/Soft Cover Books
- Phone Books
- Paper Maps
- Paper Receipts
- Sticky Notes/Post-Its
- Greeting Cards (*No batteries, foil, glitter*)
- Wrapping Paper and Tissue Paper (*No glitter, wax or foil*)

NO - TRASH

- Spiral or Metal Bindings (*Remove before tossing paper in*)
- Stickers or Labels (*Neither sticky part or back release paper*)
- Candy Wrappers (*Usually plastic, waxes and other materials*)
- Laminated Paper
- Wax Paper
- Plastic-Coated Paper
- Photographs /Photos
- Pictures
- X-Rays
- Microfiche
- Foil-Coated Paper (Wrapping paper)
- Soiled Paper and Paper Products
- Dirty Paper Plates
- Paper Towels
- Paper Napkins
- Tissues
- Kleenex



CARDBOARD RECYCLING DIRECTIONS

Remove any non-paper materials (Styrofoam, plastic caps, straws, plastic bags). Plastic windows in boxes are OKAY (i.e. pasta boxes).
FLATTEN BOXES.

- Brown Paper Bags
- Paper Egg Cartons
- Paperboard Boxes
- Clean Paper Take-Out Containers
- Coffee Cup Sleeves

NO - TRASH

- Styrofoam
- Plastic Added Items Like Straws or Lids



CARTONS RECYCLING DIRECTIONS

Remove the plastic lids, caps and straws. Make sure there's no food or liquid residue inside.

YES - RECYCLING BIN

- Juice
- Milk
- Soy And Grain Milk
- Soup And Broth
- Wine
- Cream
- Egg Substitutes



TIN, STEEL, ALUMINUM CANS & ALUMINUM FOIL RECYCLING DIRECTIONS

Empty liquid and food contents. For cans, do not crush and place lid (if metal) back on or set in container. Labels are OKAY. For aluminum foil or trays, make sure they are COMPLETELY clean and roll into a ball.

YES - RECYCLE BIN

- Aluminum Cans (Tabs okay)
- Steel & Tin Cans (Labels okay)
- Soup, Tuna, Coffee Cans (Empty! Labels okay)
- Cat food Cans (Empty! Labels okay)
- Cookie Tins and Baking Tins
- EMPTY Aerosol Cans (**Empty!** Lids ok)
- Clean Aluminum Foil (Roll it into a ball)
- Clean Aluminum Trays
- Metal lids (Left on empty glass bottles and jars or loose)

RURAL GARBAGE & RECYCLING SITES

Lincoln County operates 11 rural residential sites for collection of household garbage and recycling. The intention of the rural sites is to provide service to those rural areas of the county that do not have private collection available. This system is designed and contracted to collect **only household refuse** generated by Lincoln County residents.

VIOLATIONS

If you witness a violation of these regulations at the rural sites, including commercial disposal, please contact the Lincoln County Environmental Department at 507-694-1344. If you can provide a description of the vehicle, a license plate number, type of material dumped and date it occurred, there is a better chance of finding the violator.
