January 4, 2022 Courthouse Commissioner Room Ivanhoe, MN 56142

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Board Chair Mic VanDeVere, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Joe Wilson, Lincoln County Engineer, was present to give project updates. They were as follows:

Continue to prepare for 2022 projects

Wilson presented maintenance updates. They were as follows:

- Putting up intersection signs finished with 6 of the 15 townships
- Brought in the 1963 Osh Kosh truck to prepare for auction
- Planning to put the 2008 Ford ¾ ton pickup and the 2011 Lorenz 3 point blower on auction
- Have done snow and ice removal
- Will be doing annual maintenance on the dozer and other equipment as needed.

Wilson informed the Board that he continues to work on finalizing and closing out projects from 2020 and 2021. Information only.

Wilson requested approval on declaring the 2000 Rosko self-propelled Rubber Tire Roller as surplus. Motion by VanDeVere, seconded by Drietz, to declare the 2000 Rosko self-propelled Rubber Tire Roller as surplus to be sold through an auction site. All voted in favor.

Wilson informed the Board that there is some Ivanhoe building maintenance that needs to be done. One of the furnaces needed to be replaced. Information only.

MnDOT is planning to do a steel roof on their portion of the building. The Lincoln County portion of the roof is in good shape so we won't be doing the Lincoln County portion. Information only.

Wilson informed the Board that we sell quite a bit of pipe to townships and other customers. The current price is at \$1.00 per foot. Wilson would like to increase the cost to \$2.00 to cover our cost. Motion by Drietz, seconded by VanDeVere, to increase the selling price of Highway pipe from \$1.00 to \$2.00 per foot. All voted in favor.

Dustin Hauschild, Lincoln County Environmental, presented updates on the property cleanups. The updates were as follows:

- Work has been completed on the Ivanhoe Lumberyard site. We are still waiting for the bill from Ground Works.
- The cleanup on the Arco house is complete. The bill for initial cleanup was \$5,600.00, but we are still waiting for the landfill disposal fees.
- The Environmental office removed some household hazardous waste from the Lake Benton house. A&C will get this torn down in the next few weeks.

Hauschild informed the Board that the Ivanhoe Creamery building will need to have the tires and oil removed from the building and inquired on whether other testing such as asbestos testing should be done. Hauschild also inquired on a timeline for proposals and securing the building. Deb Vierhuf, Lincoln County Auditor-Treasurer, informed the Board that we could reach out to the interested parties to see what their proposal is, but they will still need to come to the forfeited auction to purchase that property. The minimum bid price will need to be decided for all of the forfeited properties and be set by a Resolution. The Auction date also needs to be set by Resolution. Once all of the clean-ups are complete, we can move forward with these resolutions. The Board would like the building secured and Vierhuf and Hauschild will keep in contact as things progress. Information only.

Hauschild informed the Board that two individuals need to be re-appointed to the Planning and Zoning Board. The individuals for appointment are Bill Behnke and Ron Bunjer. Hauschild stated that these individuals are in favor of being re-appointed. Motion by Hauswedell, seconded by Nielsen to approve the following appointments to the Planning and Zoning Board:

Michelle Facile, Lincoln County Recorder presented her statement of Recording Compliance for the calendar year of 2021. Facile stated that they have a maximum of 10 days to get paper documents filed and returned to the customers and a maximum of 5 days for electronic filings. The Recorders Office had all documents for 2021 filed and returned in a timely manner. Information only.

Facile presented a letter of intent to file for the office of Recorder - term starting in 2023 per statute 375a.1205 Subd. 2. Information only.

Vierhuf presented Resolution 10-2022 Authorizing County Staff to execute all necessary documents for the Opioid Multistate Settlements. Motion by VanDeVere, seconded by Hauswedell, to approve Resolution 10-2022 Authorizing County Staff to execute all necessary documents for the Opioid Multistate Settlements. All voted in favor.

## A RESOLUTION 10-2022

Authorizing county staff to execute all necessary documents to ensure County participation in the multistate settlements relating to opioid distributors and manufacturers, and in the Minnesota Opioids State-Subdivision Memorandum of Agreement, and declaring support for an amendment to Minn. Stat. § 256.043, Subd. 3(d).

WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota and numerous Minnesota cities and counties are engaged in nationwide civil litigation against manufacturers and distributors of prescription opioids related to the opioid crisis; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Attorney General has signed on to multistate settlement agreements with several pharmaceutical distributors, McKesson, Cardinal Health, and AmerisourceBergen, as well as opioid manufacturer Johnson & Johnson, but those settlement agreements are still subject to sign-on by local governments and final agreement by the companies and approval by the courts; and

WHEREAS, there is a deadline of January 2, 2022, for a sufficient threshold of Minnesota cities and counties to sign on to the above-referenced multistate settlement agreements, and failure to timely sign on may diminish the amount of funds received by not only that city or county but by all Minnesota cities and counties from the settlement funds; and

WHEREAS, representatives of Minnesota's local governments, the Office of the Attorney General, and the State of Minnesota have reached agreement on the intrastate allocation of these settlement funds between the State, and the counties and cities, as well as the permissible uses of these funds, which will be memorialized in the Minnesota Opioids State-Subdivision Memorandum of Agreement (the "State-Subdivision Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, during negotiations of the State-Subdivision Agreement, representatives of Minnesota's counties prioritized flexibility in how local governments may use settlement funds for opioids abatement and remediation and advocated for counties to receive settlement allocations directly rather than using the distribution mechanism detailed in Minn. Stat. § 256.043, Subd. 3(d); and

WHEREAS, in order to achieve the goals of flexibility and direct allocation, Minn. Stat. § 256.043, subd. 3(d), must be amended to remove a provision which would otherwise appropriate approximately 50 percent of the state's settlement allocation to county social service agencies for statutorily-prescribed use(s); and

WHEREAS, the State-Subdivision Agreement creates an opportunity for local governments and the State to work collaboratively on a unified vision to deliver a robust abatement and remediation plan to address the opioid crisis in Minnesota; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, Lincoln County supports and agrees to the State-Subdivision Agreement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Lincoln County supports and opts in to the multistate settlements with McKesson, Cardinal Health, and AmerisourceBergen, and with Johnson & Johnson; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Lincoln County authorizes county staff to execute all necessary documents to ensure County participation in the multistate settlements, including the Participation Agreement and accompanying Release, and in the State-Subdivision Agreement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Lincoln County, supports the amending of Minn. Stat. § 256.043, subd. 3(d), to remove a provision which would appropriate approximately 50 percent of the state's settlement allocation to county social service agencies via the existing Opiate Epidemic Response Fund distribution mechanism for statutorily-prescribed use(s).
